#### SESSION DIGEST

# Highlights of the June 18, 2019 Session Meeting

Elders met jointly with the Deacons following a dinner reception to recognize our church staff for their outstanding work.

Three confirmands were presented to Session by their adult counselors and received into membership of the church.

The Congregational Life Committee announced that the Chicken and Corn Roast will be held on August 1.

The Finance Committee reported that pledge income is less than last year as of May 31. It was explained that the Permanent Endowment Fund income will be less than recent years. The committee plans to start the Stewardship campaign earlier this year. A

written outline of expenses and income through May 31 was distributed.

Outreach provided a written report of committee activities.

The Christian Education Committee distributed a document entitled Stewardship Fund Proposal with an attachment entitled Our Church School, a Renewed Vision of Excellence. Session was given an overview of the church school activities that are being planned, and the vacant Cristian Education director position. The Christian Education Committee recommended that the funding for this position come from the Stewardship Fund. Following a discussion, Session \$11.000 expended approved be from Stewardship Fund for the year 2020 to fund the Christian Education Director position. A search for a Christian Education Director will take place this summer.

The Administration Committee Chair gave a general overview of possible revisions to the Sexual Misconduct Prevention Policy to be reviewed at the August Session meeting.

The Worship Committee notified Session that we need more volunteers to help with the visual display during worship service. The committee also discussed the possibility of using worship models to enhance worship. Session approved a recommendation that we sponsor another coffee house fundraiser to benefit the music program on September 15 or 22. Session also approved the sale of the used baby grand piano in the fellowship hall, which is in need of many repairs and is no longer needed.

The Communications Committee has updated the church directory with new and larger photos. In addition, members' names are also better organized. The revised directory is available online to members with their login password. The committee is also working on some new social media ideas, and new signs will be made up for church school for the fall.

Pastor Karen announced that we will be changing to a narrative lectionary beginning in the fall, which provides for more of a chronological story of the Bible. She informed Session that she is attending a wellness retreat in August and will be returning to Oregon in late July or early August to attend to personal matters.

Session also approved the following items at the meeting:

- ➤ A baptism to be held on June 23.
